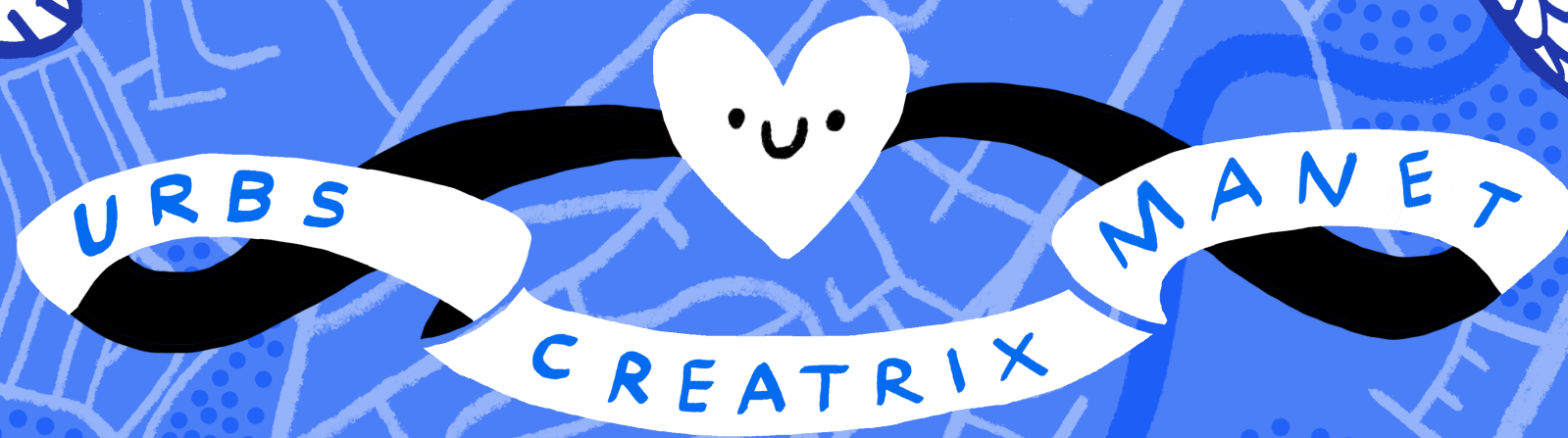

Garter Lane Arts Centre 6

Garter Lane Arts Centre spans two Georgian buildings, 5 and 22a O'Connell Street, in the heart of Waterford City, and is a renowned base for culture and creativity across many artistic disciplines. Garter Lane Arts Centre houses visual art studios, a sprung dance floor, LRK theatre co, a children's workshop, a project space, a fully operational theatre with modern cinema facilities and two dedicated gallery spaces.
